November 6th Meeting

Minutes of meeting - November 6, 2012



President Duncan S. Robertson called the meeting to order at 7PM and welcomed everyone. Visitors this month included Ron, Wayne, Jim, Curtis, John, Gord, Ward, Herm, David and Luke (from www.lukeweiser.com fame!). It seems this set a record for visitors to the guild meeting! Carl generously offered membership to any of the new visitors who would like to join.

Duncan called on Herm Stolte to tell us about the annual SAWS/CWT joint Christmas get together. It will be held at 7PM December 19^{th} at The Scarboro Community Centre Hall is located at:

1727 14th Avenue SW, Calgary.

Neil Proctor gave an update on the Spruce Meadows activity and asked people to sign up for booth duty. Jim Osenton cautioned that we accept only VISA and not Mastercard, and to ensure that the buyers phone number is written on the receipt. This allows us to contact the person in case of any issue with the card. Neil also mentioned that next year Spruce Meadows would be held for 3 weekends rather than 2. Early next year there will be a group discussion at the meeting as to whether or not we will choose to attend the event, as considerable more effort will be required. Don James asked about glass door display cases. Ron Gilbert may be able to get 4 of them and will work with Don on this. Also Ron Falconer has some that require minor repair. It seems like we now have about 400+ tops for Spruce Meadows this year. More are appreciated! There was some discussion as to the price we should charge as some thought that \$2 was too low. An effort will be made to price these at \$2 and possibly some at \$5. This is to be determined. This year we need to have a proper sign for the tops - not a hand written one.

There will be a Sawdust Session at the Calgary Drop In Center on Saturday, December 29th at the Calgary Drop-In Center.

Terry announced that Black Forest now carry cut resistant Kevlar gloves which are great for mitigating carving accidents. While not bulletproof, they do resist slicing cuts quite well. He also mentioned that Jamie Russell would be at Black Forest to present a weekend course in carving. As well, a pyrography course and skateboard making courses are imminent. Greg Dahl will work on presenting the finance statements at the next meeting.

Bert Delisle talked about a new clamp he had made by Gary's son, Craig Goddard of Corma Industries (www.cormaindustries.com) for a Stronghold chuck used on the Vicmarc. This is designed to ensure that the chuck does not come loose when the lathe is used in reverse. A picture follows of the clamp and mounting on the lathe, both without and with the clamp. Mike Swendson announced that there will be a top turning event and that a spin-off will follow and prizes awarded for various categories.









Club Meetings

Jamie Russell got his first tool, an official Boy Scout pocket knife, for Christmas when he was nine. He started shaping wood with it and hasn't quit since. His education includes the Cabinet Making Program, SIAAST, Saskatoon and in the mid 80s, an apprenticeship in California, with Art Carpenter, one of the godfathers of the contemporary furniture making movement.

He is a founding member of the Furniture Society and has taught at Arrowmont in TN. His solo show at the Mendel Gallery in Saskatoon was featured in the Winter 2011 issue of "Woodwork" magazine.
