# March 5th Meeting

## Minutes of meeting - March 5, 2013

Since Duncan was off flying the friendly skies of Brazil this month, Vice-President Mike Swendson called the meeting to order at 7PM and welcomed everyone. Four visitors were present this month: Derrick Anderson, Doug Rowan, Mike Reaville and Marian Warnan.

This month is the CWT Annual General Meeting. A very welcome new addition to the executive this year is Terry Golbeck. The executive will meet prior to the April meeting to discuss assignments and will announce results at the CWT meting April  $2^{nd}$ . Next month the last page of this newsletter will be updated accordingly.

For the May meeting, we are still hoping to have Gord Langer present at the meeting to demo deep hollow turning. Note that this system is currently on sale at a 2 for 1 price!

Regarding deep hollowing, Don West has a Oneway system he will be happy to discuss with anyone who may be interested in exploring this aspect of turning.

The next Sawdust Session is March 16<sup>th</sup>. Possibly Jim Osenton will handle this session as Mike has a prior engagement.

Greg Dahl reports we have money in the bank and the bills are paid. He will have a detailed report at the April meeting.

Spruce Meadows will go forward this year for the full three weeks. We will have a new system for collection of payment this year. Neil will provide training on this prior to the event. Further details will follow.

There followed some discussion regarding providing compensation for people giving demonstrations at the meetings. A motion to pay a nominal amount was proposed by Dave and seconded by Doug.

Jim Jones has been in contact with the school in Okotoks and there will be a turning event tentatively scheduled for April 27<sup>th</sup>. There will be 3 lathes setup all for a cost of \$10.00, which includes lunch.

Don James mentioned that Jim Jones as well as Joe Van Keulen were recently featured in the Alberta "Routes" magazine.

Terry Golbeck said that he has recently been asked by a lady to teach her husband, who is blind, to turn in his shop. The first session went well and Terry was asked if we could provide some ongoing assistance with help to make various jigs for him. The exact nature is yet to be determined, but there was a consensus that we would help when the requirements are better known.

A break was then called and some informal discussion over the Instant Gallery took place!



- 1. Overall length of the finial is properly proportioned to the size of the vessel or ornament
- 2. The finial generally contains long, smooth flowing tapers and is not chunky
- 3. The weight of the finial is in the first third from the base and the last two thirds are lighter, thinner and more flowing. The finial tip should not add too much weight to the end of the finial.


Mike then demonstrated turning a finial using the guidelines presented. He began by rounding a square to 1-1/4" diameter. Starting at the tip end, he worked down towards what will become the base. Once turning this section, it is important not to

Following the break, Mike Swendson demonstrated the fundamentals of designing and making finials. In general terms, he described a finial as a decorative piece that fits on the top of buildings, turned boxes and even curtain rod ends. He discussed and showed various proportions of finials and generally what constitutes a good, pleasing design.

Finials can add a lot of elegance to your lidded vessels or ornaments. However, poor finial design can seriously detract from the impression you're trying to create from your piece.

Elegant finials generally have three design concepts that set them apart from those more poorly done.

- Golden Mean ratio 1:1.618 or approximately 1/3 to 2/3
- It isn't possible to get all elements to follow this rule, but the main elements should.

return to this area. Once completed to the base, it is carefully sanded to 320 grit. A 1" tenon is turned at the base for mounting in the vessel, and the entire finial finished with a leather dye (Marine boot black) he obtains from Tandy Leather. Two coats are applied and dried with a hair dryer between coats. Maple was used for the demo, and the net result looks like Ebony. Mike suggests working out a design on paper before actually turning it on the lathe.

Thanks to Mike for an excellent presentation!


The Dave Beeman draw was held and in addition to much wood being won, Dwayne Sims won \$47.50 in the 50/50 draw.

Jim Osenton gathered some items from the gallery table and a critique and discussion followed. The meeting was then adjourned at 9:15PM


