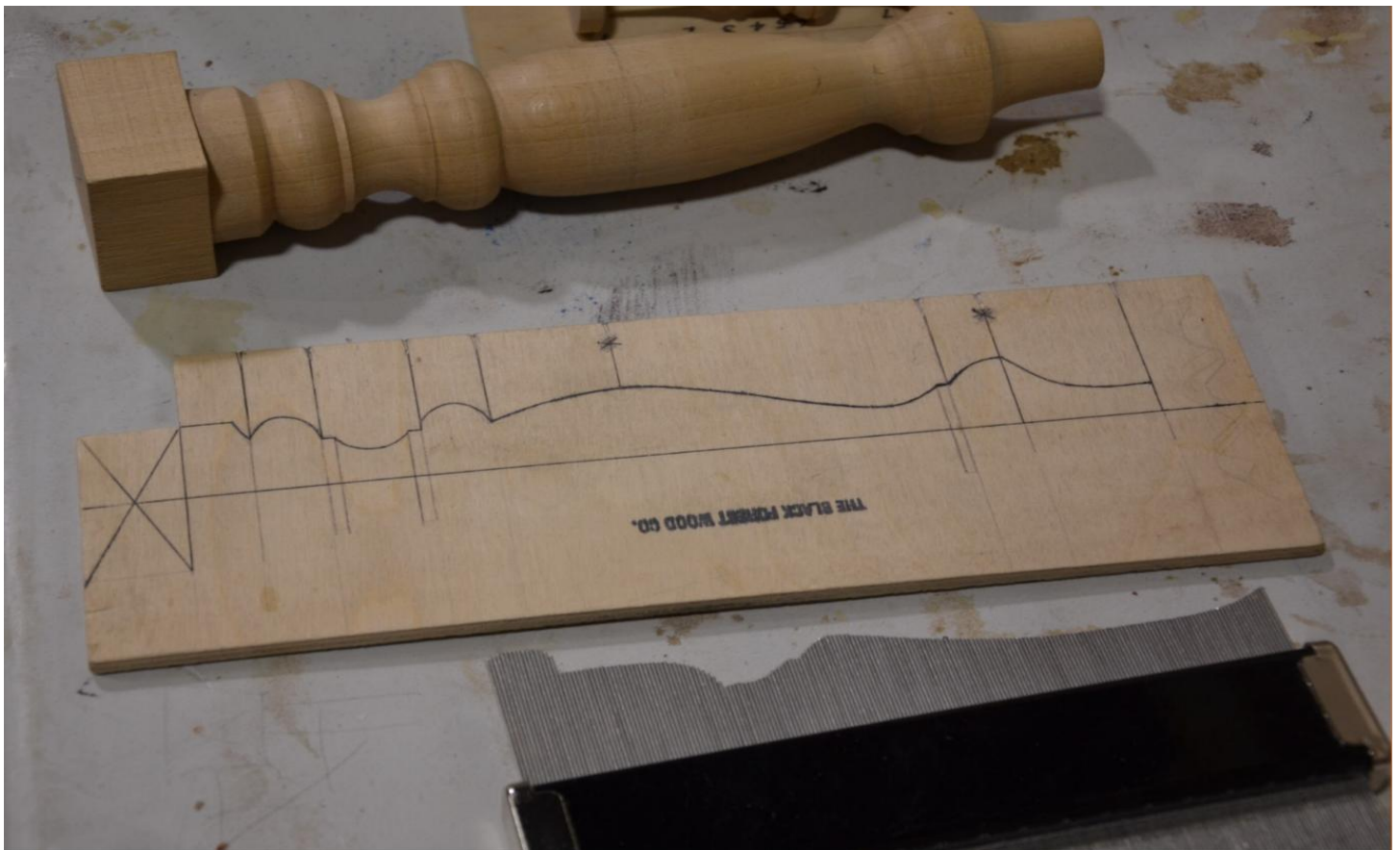

Norm called the meeting to order at 7:00 Precisely.

### **Guests**

Guest were Victor, who just signed up as a new member, and Mark, who was also present last month but also just signed up as a member. Welcome.

### **Sawdust Session**

It was announced that our January sawdust session would take place on January 13th.

### **Automated Electronic Defibrillator**

Several meetings ago Wilf told the guild how a fellow was saved at a symposium he was at by use of an AED (automated Electronic Defibrillator). Considering the age of most of our members, it was suggested that it wouldn't be a bad idea if one was kept at Black Forest. Norm informed the guild that right after that meeting Terry went out and purchased one. It was moved by Carl Smith and seconded by Wilf Talbot and the guild reimburse Terry for 1/2 of the cost, or \$600.00. The motion was passed.

## **Hand Turned Duplication**

Terry Golbeck gave a demonstration on how to duplicate a turning by hand. The next page prepared by Terry gives the process. During the demo Terry copied a turning similar to the one pictured on his handout.

Terry already had his story stick (pattern) made, so he started with the square to round transition. To start the transition he used a skew chisel. With the skew long point down, and starting well to the right of the line marking where the transition was to be, he brought the handle of the skew up. Each cut was a little deeper, with the waste on the right hand side and the bevel of the skew parallel to the side of the transition, he crept up to the line. Once at the line, he used a roughing gouge to turn the rest of the piece round, and finalized the cylinder with the skew chisel.

Once smooth and round he used the story stick to transfer the point lines to the piece, and then using the skew chisel with the long. point down, he cut V notches at each of the layout points. Terry then showed his techniques for cutting beads and coves to duplicate the piece.

## **BREAK**

After the break Dave Beaman did his raffle and several lots of wood found new homes. Dwayne Sims won \$67.00 and a bowl blank in the 50/50 draw.

## Hand Turned Duplication

### Make a Story Stick

Orient the pattern so that the bulk of the piece will be driven at the headstock end.

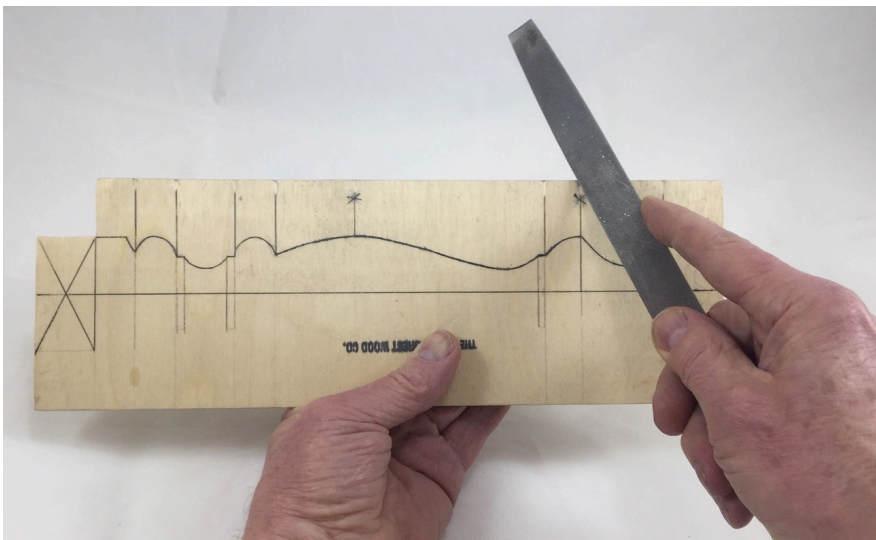
Draw the profile along the middle of the Story Stick.

Mark the major transitions from one shape to another and the high points.

Draw a series of lines, perpendicular to the edge of the story stick, at the transitions where a “V” shaped layout cut will be used.

Draw a series of lines to the edge at the high points and shade these high point lines.

Using the corner edge of a hand file, make a notch at the location of the “V” cut lines and the high point lines. The pencil lead will sit securely in this notch for layout on the spinning wood.



Note: This pattern is notched on the left side for clearance to allow the square corners of the blank to clear the pattern while spinning on the lathe.

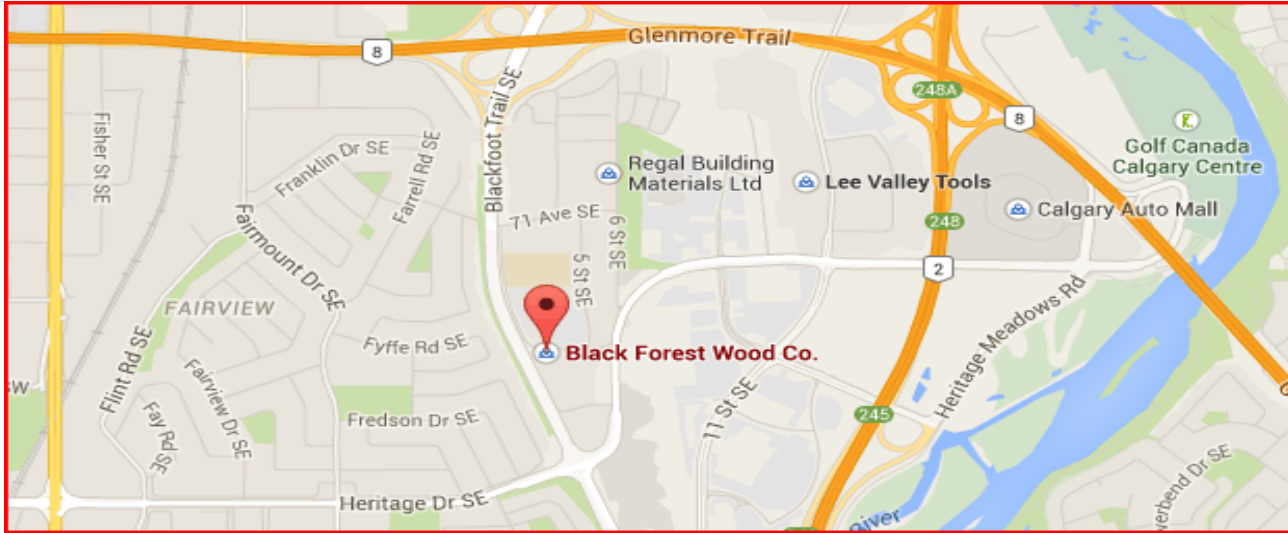






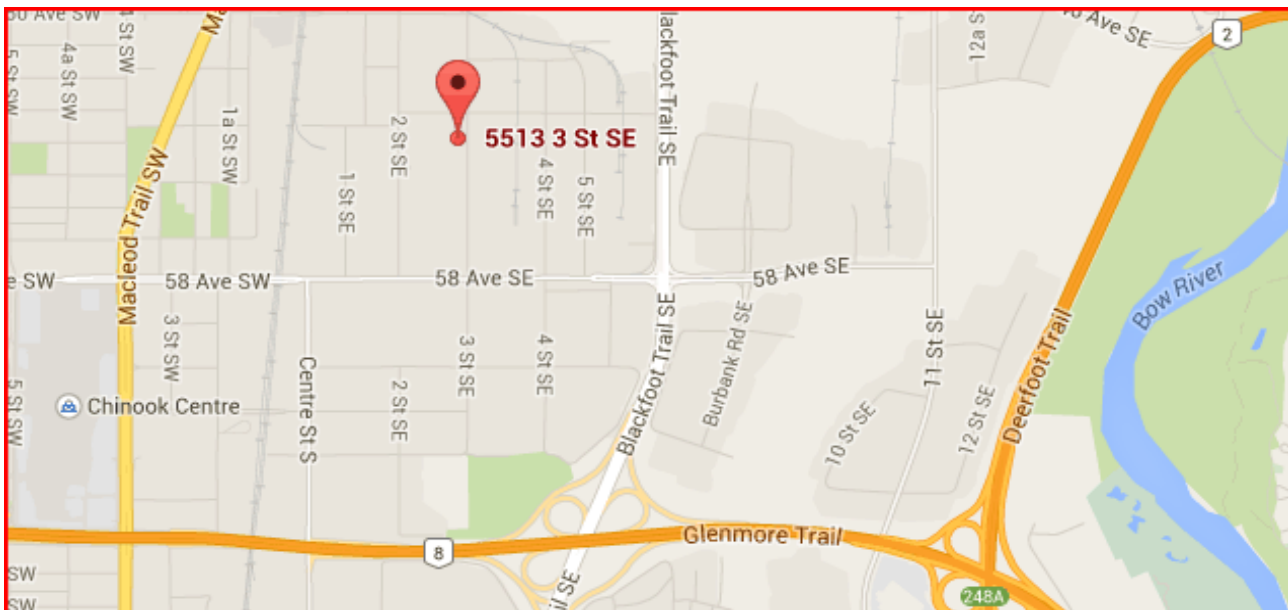
## Guild Meetings
